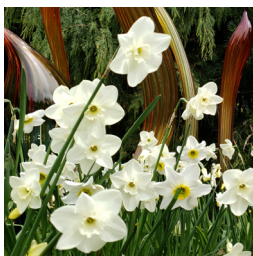

Sinopel Daffodil

Narcissus 'Sinopel'

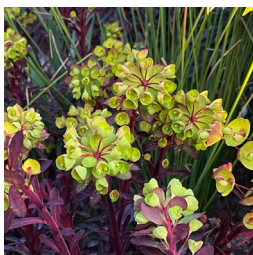
This flower defies the traditional daffodil look with a flattened cup and overlapping petals. The olive-green corona pairs with the mature color palette of the Amber Herons bed.



Rhododendrons

Rhododendron

Chihuly's mother, Viola Chihuly, had a deep affection for Rhododendrons and grew them competitively.



Miner's Merlot Spurge

Euphorbia 'Miner's Merlot'

Bunches of lime green, cup-shaped flowers set atop deep purple foliage are a splash of fun rivalling the fiery colors and shapes of the Tiger Marlin.



Chromacolor Daffodil

Narcissus 'Chromacolor'

The Chromacolor Daffodil's cup is yellow-orange when it first blooms and then fades to a salmon pink as it ages, providing bright contrast against the deep blue tones of the Cobalt Reeds and Fiori.



Grape Hyacinth

Muscari armeniacum

The Grape Hyacinth's delicate clusters of round purple flowers provide a low-growing pop of color amongst the Black Glass and bring out the blue accents found in many of the Nijima Floats.



Moonlight Sensation Daffodils

Narcissus 'Moonlight Sensation'

Moonlight Sensation can produce 20 or more flowers from a single bulb. The ivory petals bring attention to the gold leaf and shimmering tones of the Niijima Floats.



White Medal Daffodil

Narcissus 'White Medal'

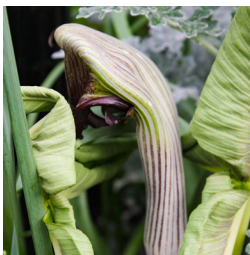
This non-traditional daffodil boasts bright white ruffled petals. The blooms rise dramatically above the unfurling fern fronds.



Japanese Andromeda

Pieris japonica

The Japanese Andromeda sports cascading clusters of bell-shaped white flowers throughout April, almost appearing like mounds of snow amongst the other bright spring blooms.



Cobra Lily

Arisaema ringens

The deep purple stripes and otherworldly shape of the Cobra Lily mimic both the color and form of the Black Saguaro, while the spring green leaves provide vibrant contrast.
